#### ANZAC Day Commemorations



The sub-Branch led our traditional commemorations for ANZAC Day. There was a great attendance at the Dawn Service with, what is probably, a record number of wreaths laid. Service clubs, youth groups as well as many local schools joined the veterans to remember service and sacrifice during conflicts past. The address at both services was given by Commodore Melinda Barnes and her contribution is appreciated.

Our two services were well supported with assistance from Emergency Services, Volunteer Organisations and Hornsby RSL Pipe Band. 226 Regional Cadet Unit provided the catafalque party and assisted with the flags. A unique element of the Sunday Service was the presence of a CDC bus with a special ANZAC livery. Many thanks to the CDC NSW

Northmead Depot Manager, Joshua Gray, for his assistance. As always, our sub-Branch members supported the conduct of both services. In addition, for the first time, the sub-Branch engaged a company to set up and dismantle the necessary infrastructure and this arrangement worked well.

### Middle East Area of Operations Commemoration 11 July

As a consequence of a motion carried at the 2023 Annual General Meeting, RSL NSW is proceeding with an inaugural Middle East Area of Operations (MEAO) commemoration on 11 July 2024, and continues to lobby RSL Australia for a national commemorative day.

The MEAO commemoration will honour those ADF personnel who served in conflicts in the Middle East and Afghanistan during 2001 – 2021. It marks the date on 11 July 2021 when Australian troops were withdrawn from Afghanistan. ANZAC House is seeking feedback from the Young Veterans Committee to ensure the event meets the expectations of this cohort.

An official service will take place at the Cenotaph in Martin Place, Sydney, at 11am on Thursday 11 July 2024. All RSL NSW members, the wider veteran community, and members of the public are welcome to attend. More information about the commemoration will be announced closer to the date.

### Tank Crews in Vietnam Documentary

## Heritage

### Snippets from the Past.

#### What people have been doing over the past 50 years

As George notes in his message, the sub-Branch is currently working up a proposal to amend one of the plaques on the Hornsby Cenotaph. The intent is to replace the rather generic 'Other Conflicts' plaque with one which provides more detail on the ADF's post-Vietnam activities. By amending the wording, the sub-Branch is seeking to recognise the diverse and wide span of Defence activities and commitments of ADF personnel over the past 50 years. The following paragraphs summarise the operations and defence deployments grouped in the same manner as the proposed wording on the new plaque. The dates identified below have been taken from the Defence eligibility criteria for various clasps recognising service in particular operations.

### Afghanistan

Afghanistan recognises the various operations in that country from 2001 until 2021.

### Iraq and other Middle East Operations

The Iraq acknowledges the various commitments to that country from 1991 to 2022. Other Middle East operations recognise deployments beyond Iraq including but not limited to:

- Operations in the Middle East, Persian Gulf, Gulf of Aden, the Red Sea, the Arabian Sea and the Gulf of Oman; (1975-2023)
- Kuwait (1990-2003);
- Lebanon (2006-2008);
- Sinai (1982-1986 and 1993-2023);
- Bahrain, Cyprus, Jordan, Qatar, United Arab Emirates (2014 onwards); and
- West Sahara (1991-2012).

**Timor and Other South East Asia Operations**

Timor recognises the various operations in East Timor and then Timor Leste from 1999 to 2012 and other SE Asian operations include but are not limited to:

- Cambodia (1991-1999);
- Singapore and Malaysia Operations (1975-1989);
- South Vietnam Evacuation operations in 1975; and
- Irian Jaya (1976-1981)

**Solomon Islands and Other South West Pacific Operations**

Solomon Islands recognise the two major operations in that country initially from 2000 to 2002 and then again in 2003 and 2013. Other South West Pacific operations include:

- Bougainville (1997- 2003); and
- Fiji (2006).

**United Nations and other Operations**

The ADF has been involved in numerous UN operations as well as others outside of the UN mantle. Operations include but are not limited to:

- Iran/Iraq (UNIMOG) (1988-1991)
- Ethiopia (UNMEE) (2001-2005)
- Namibia (UNTAG) (1989-1990)
- Guatemala (1997);
- the Balkans (1992-2012);
- Kashmir (1975-1985);
- Mozambique (1994-2002)
- Peshawar (1989-1993);
- Somalia (1992-1995);
- South Sudan (2011-2023);
- Sudan (2005-2011);
- Uganda (1982-1984);
- Rwanda (1994-1996);
- Sierra Leone (2001-2003);
- Korea after (1975 onwards);
- Border Protection (1997 onwards)

It's certainly been a busy 50 years!!
